History

Two Mountain Winery is a family affair. Owned and operated by brothers Matthew and Patrick Rawn, their family has been farming the rich soil of the Rattlesnake Hills area of Washington State for more than half a century. In 1951, Phil Schmidt established Schmidt Orchards with 40 acres of peaches, apricots, prunes, and apples. Today, three generations contribute their talents and expertise to Two Mountain Winery and the 26-acre estate vineyard.

The small family winery produces a modest 3,000 cases annually, but is poised for growth under the leadership of the Rawn Brothers who believe great wine is the result of the perfect blend of elegance and fun.

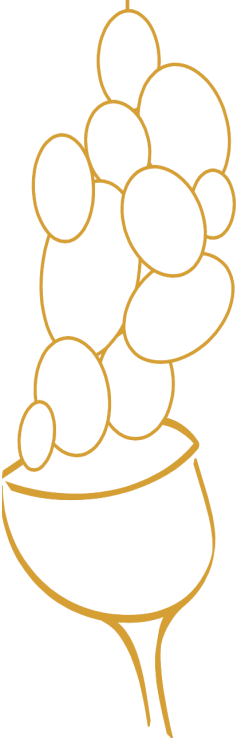
After purchasing Two Mountain Winery and Estate Vineyard from their late uncle Ron Schmidt's estate in 2006, the brothers set out to put their own fingerprint on the family business by launching a new look for their classic, hand-crafted varietal wines. With new branding in place, Matthew and Patrick aggressively pursued distribution outside the state. Two Mountain wines are now available in four U.S. states and Japan, with additional markets to come.

Inspired by majestic Mt. Rainier and Mt. Adams that form the breathtaking backdrop of Two Mountain's 26-acre estate vineyard, Matthew has served as winemaker and vineyard manager for the winery since its inception in 2002. Patrick manages finances and day-to-day operations of the winery and vineyard. Two Mountain currently produces eight varietal wines, a dry rose' and a red blend, with the majority of grapes sourced from Two Mountain's estate vineyard.

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The winery produces eight varietal wines – Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Chardonnay, Riesling, Syrah, Lemberger, Cabernet Sauvignon and Touiga Nacional – along with a Dry Rose' and a Red Blend. The majority of the grapes are sourced from Two Mountain's estate vineyard.

Two Mountain wines are currently available throughout Washington state, Oregon, Idaho, Massachusetts, Hawaii and Japan and will soon be distributed in additional U.S. markets. Two Mountain wines are renowned for their tremendous value, offering exceptional quality at an accessible price point.

Two Mountain Winery 2004 Yakima Valley Merlot – \$20

Initially this wine screams of blackberry and fresh ripe Bing cherries making you think of all of your favorite summer fruits. As one delves deeper into this surprising gem, hints of rose petal, eucalyptus, clove, cocoa, tar and a nice edge of oak awaken your senses to a point of excitement. The deep color and fruit from the nose through the finish this classic Washington state Merlot.

Two Mountain Winery 2004 Yakima Valley Syrah – \$22

Aromas of dark cherry, ripe black berries and plum dominate the nose of this splendid Syrah. The palate opens with the peppery varietal characteristic we have all come to know and love, followed by dark cherry, anise, tobacco, black berries, and the slightest insinuation of French oak ending with the most delicious velvety, chewy tannin. Northwest Syrah at it finest.

Two Mountain Winery 2004 Yakima Valley Cabernet Sauvignon – \$25

This beautifully balanced Cabernet opens with stunning aromas of blackberry, dark cherry, allspice and toasty French oak. With flavors of blackberry, plum, dark Bing cherry, and tobacco framed by the French oak and soft velvety tannins this Cabernet is a pleasure now or cellared.

Smelling this wine says it all. Wonderfully deep aromas of ripe berries, toasted French oak, roasted meats and vanilla are followed by pleasing flavors of blackberry, dark cherries, allspice and soft velvety tannins, all surrounded by wonderfully integrated toasted oak.

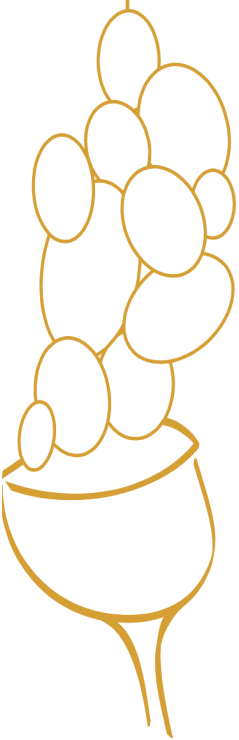
Two Mountain Winery N/V Yakima Valley Tribute (Red Blend) – \$54

A special non-vintage red blend honoring Two Mountain's founder and Matt and Patrick's uncle, Ron Schmidt. This blend of 90 percent Cabernet Sauvignon, five percent Merlot, three percent Syrah and two percent Cabernet Franc was aged in 90 percent new French oak and bottle aged for 18 months. Each barrel of this blend was hand selected for this extraordinary wine. Aromas of dark cherry, ripe blackberries and tobacco are followed by a palate of cherry, berries, roast meats, allspice and hints of pepper, all framed by the perfect balance of French oak.

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Two Mountain Vineyard

Two Mountain's name was inspired by majestic Mt. Rainier and Mt. Adams that form the breathtaking backdrop the winery's 26-acre estate vineyard. Located in the Rattlesnake Hills region of the Yakima Valley - Washington state's oldest appellation - three generations have farmed the land since the 1950s. In 1951, Matt and Patrick Rawn's grandfather Phil Schmidt established Schmidt Orchards with 40 acres of peaches, apricots, prunes and apples. Matt planted wine grapes on the land with his uncle Ron Schmidt in Spring 2000 and crushed Two Mountain Winery's first vintage in 2002. Today, Matt and Patrick grow eight grape varieties in Two Mountain Vineyard: Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Chardonnay, Riesling, Syrah, Lemberger, Cabernet Sauvignon and Touiga Nacional.

The Cascade mountain range provides a wonderful rain-shadow effect on Two Mountain Vineyard, which is situated on a south-facing slope 1,198 feet above sea level. It is a very warm site, with an ideal 190-day growing season and annual precipitation of only approximately six inches. Warm days and cool nights provide the Yakima Valley with near-perfect growing conditions, allowing both red and white grape varieties to fully express their classic characteristics. During the last ice age, the great Missoula Floods deposited ancient volcanic sediment across the region, creating a rich blend of sandy and rocky soils that shape the distinct character of Two Mountain Vineyard.

Vineyard Crew – Four Times Annually

Two Mountain Winery's "Vineyard Crew" lets wine lovers and aspiring viticulturists unleash their inner farmers and learn what it takes to grow premium wine grapes in the heart of Yakima Valley. Vineyard Crew sessions are led by Two Mountain Vineyard manager Patrick Rawn, with support from winemaker Matt Rawn. From pruning to thinning, veraison to harvest, crew members tend to assigned Vineyard Crew vines at four key growing periods during the year so they experience the grape growing cycle first hand. Each of the four, half-day sessions includes a finger-filthyng enological experience followed by wine and appetizers in the Two Mountain cellar. Vineyard Crew members receive generous discounts of 15 percent off per bottle/20 percent off per case, an exclusive member tee-shirt and, of course, dirty hands and serious bragging rights. Priced at \$85 per person or \$150 per couple.

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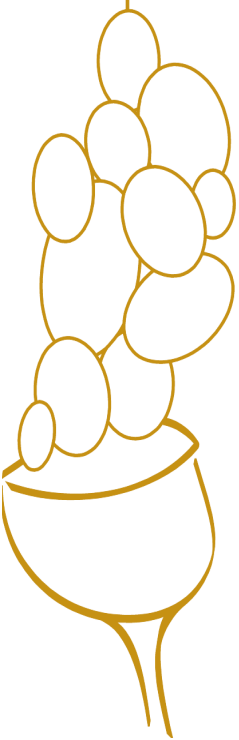

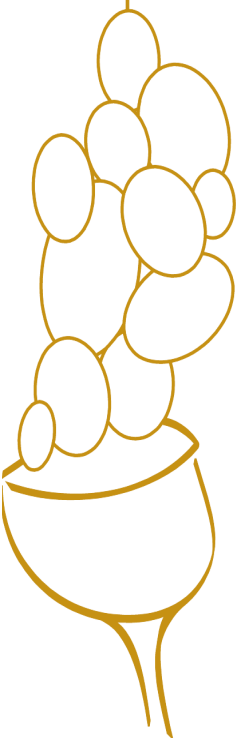
